Transport Information

By Bus

Cork has a vast bus network connecting the county with Dublin, Limerick, Galway and many more destinations.

[Bus Éireann](#), the national public bus service, departs from Parnell Place Station as does [Expressway](#) while private operators like [Citylink](#), [Aircoach](#) and [Dublin Coach](#) operators arrive/depart nearby from Anderson's Quay and Lower Glanmire Road.

UCC is served by public transport by two City Bus routes (No 205 and No 208), connecting the campus to Cork City Centre via Washington and St Patrick Streets.

The No 208 picks up passengers on St. Patrick's Street and stops on Western Road. While the No 205 departs from Kent station and stops on College Road/O'Donovan's Road.

By Rail

Cork's Kent Station offers easy access to the national rail network and is just a 10-minute walk from the City Centre. For more information visit the [Irish Rail](#) website.

To get to UCC from the station, hop on the No 205 bus which serves College Road.

Parking at UCC

If you're travelling by car, there are two visitor car parks on campus. Be mindful that these are open to all visitors and can become full quite quickly.

The two main visitor car parks are charged at €2 per hour and are located at:
